- **News from principal, Kristian Ryerson:**
 - Registration and staffing:
 - The district's data shows that registration will be on the low end due to students moving out of state as well as to charter schools. Right now it's looking like there will be 3 teachers at every grade level. This is a loss on 1 general education teacher and 1 special education resource staff.
 - The district removed the STAR program and replaced it with a second early ed program (half day pre-k).
 - Teacher requests and bios will be sent out at the end of April when they know how many teachers will be staffed.
 - The district has not sent out information on when next year's registration will open up. We will get information out on this as soon as we know.
 - Hybrid Distance Model Update: Began March 1 and 65 students attended. We had very little crying and lot's of smiles!!! It was so great to see and hear children on campus!

- Suggestion: A wheely backpack may be better for the students as all of the supplies that they need to bring to and from school are heavy on their backs.
- Returning to school:
 - Dr. Jara has announced that April 6th will be the first day back to in person, full 5 days of instruction. This will be 36 days of in person instruction before the end of the year.
 - Parents/Guardians have the option to stay with at home distance learning.
 - Our school does not have additional staff to accommodate both models. This will be challenging for 3,4,and 5 due to low staffing.
 - Another survey will go out to Gibson families asking if they plan to have their students join the in person instruction.
 - Depending on how many students want to come back a lottery system may be used in order to stay within the guideline percentages.
 - Social distancing guideline must be followed and may be changed per district by April 6th---- CCSD going with governor's orders which is currently 3 feet apart social distance without barriers between children and 6 feet apart for the adult and student and adult to adult interactions.
 - Recess - We will still follow the 3 feet apart social distancing guideline and do structured activities outside for students.
 - No soft seating in classrooms - all surfaces must be cleanable.
 - Teachers will attempt to teach in person at the same time as those learners at home.
 - Students most likely will return to the normal teacher assignment.
- Things to consider:
 - Parents must complete a daily health screening for their students and keep the child home if they are sick.
 - Masks must be worn at all times with the exception of lunch time.
 - Students will remain in their seats for the duration of the school day.
 - Students transition only when necessary.
 - Students will bring supplies to and from school. No sharing of supplies or food. Bring a water bottle all year as the water fountains will not be usable.
 - Students need to go to their assigned bathroom to help with contact tracing.
 - Any materials or supplies given to the students need to come back and forth.
 - Volunteers, field trips, etc. are still not allowed for the remainder of this year.
- A Lot of questions will be answered when the school gets the data back and they have an idea of the percentage of students coming back.

- **School Performance Plan, Mrs. Keith:**
 - Done annually with 3 goals chosen. They have not finalized this as there is still so many unknown variables regarding next year. In the past the goals have related to the following:
 - ELA goals with the district's help.
 - 2018 SBAC data - 64% students proficient in ELA ---> based on 2019 data, Gibson goal for 2021-2022 will be blank %.
 - Math
 - Attendance.
 - Based on 9.1% (which was the last data pulled before pandemic) our school attendance has increased tremendously. We correlate this to distance learning. We are waiting for the district to advise administrators of which numbers they will be going by as this will determine a lot.
 - Information on last year's School Performance Plan can be read on the Gibson website under the "Family Information" tab.

- **Go for the Gold, Mrs. Goodman:**
 - The specialists have organized a way to send home something special for the students of the month. Each month a teacher nominates students and these are delivered. This month the program started up again and it's going well.
